Today happens to be what has become known as "Groundhog Day." According to tradition, the groundhog comes out of his hole in the ground, and if he sees his shadow we are to have 6 more weeks of winter. However, if you check your calendar, you will discover that regardless whether he sees his shadow or not, it will still be 6 weeks until spring. And, ceremonially this is all celebrated at Punxsutawney, Pa. There is a groundhog called "Punxsutawney Phil." This little fellow is kept in a heated cage. And with all the lights of television etc. I'm sure he sees his shadow!

It's interesting to note some of "Phil's" accomplishments. Just to name a few...

- He wore a yellow ribbon in 1981 in honor of the hostages in Iran.
- He traveled to Washington in 1986 to see President Reagan.
- He met Gov. Thornburg in 1987
- A movie was made in 1993
- He was on TV with Oprah in 1995
- Every year he draws over 30,000 people to the town of Punxsutawney.

So, spiritually, can we learn anything from this little guy? I think there are at least 2 things we can learn.

- 1. When he builds his house, he always has an entrance and an exit.
- 2. He is always on the alert.

In the bible we learn from this in I Peter 5:8... "Be sober, be vigilant, because your adversary the devil as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." In other words be alert, watchful, wide awake or on guard!

And, in I Cor. 10:13 we learn (just like the groundhog) to have a plan of ESCAPE. "There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way of escape, that ye may be able to bear it."

If we compare shadows, Phil supposedly predicts the weather with his shadow. In Acts 5:15, we see that the shadow of Peter healed people. Today, meteorologists with their sophisticated instruments predict the weather. But can they discern the "signs of the times?" Matt. 6:2-3...

"He (Jesus) answered and said unto them, when it is evening, ye say, it will be fair weather for the sky is red. (3) And in the morning it will be foul weather today: for the sky is red and lowring. O ye hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky: but can ye not discern the sign of the times?"

It definitely adds time and quality to your body's life. So, do something about it and I wish you well.









A WORD STUDY

EPH 6:11-13 Put on the whole armour of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil...... wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

Too many see themselves as standing in the middle of the battle, in the struggle, fighting in their own strength. Can I show you that in these three verses God sees you after the battle, standing victoriously in your armour. This is His prophetic declaration (promise) to us, "when it's all over (the battle) you will still be standing" even though it has seemed nothing has been working and you have done all that you can do. <u>STAND</u> on His promise, stand on the word, in faith...you are the VICTOR! I Cor 1:18, I Cor 2:5, I Peter 5:8-9, Isaiah 54:7, Isaiah 55:1. Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Heb 11:1. Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not unto your own understanding, in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Prov 3:5-6.

In this word study we see that the word <u>withstand</u> is much different than the word <u>stand</u> in EPH 6:11. God sees you standing after the battle, victorious over the enemy in His (God's) strength. The promise is...if you have submitted yourself to God (Prov 3:5-6) the enemy has no choice but to flee when you declare (speak) the word to him. For God is careful to watch over His word Jer 1:12, I Cor 1:9, Heb 10:23.

Comment: Jesus never called us to <u>resist</u> in our strength but to stand by faith on His word and His promise. For God has said: Do not be afraid nor dismayed, because of this great multitude (spiritual warfare) for the battle

is not yours, but God's....Position yourself (<u>stand</u>) and see the salvation of the Lord. II Chron 20:15, Ex 14:13, II Kings 6:16.

We have been equipped with the weapons sufficient to defeat Satan's works and strategies. We must see ourselves as soldiers in the Lords army. As I mentioned earlier the word <u>stand</u> is a militaristic word meaning "not to be defeated by your enemy, a force". The early church actually saw themselves in a militaristic way...actually in a war with Satan, and as the unsurpassing conqueror.

Paul is saying here in Eph 6:11-13, everything will be brought to a conclusion. <u>Put on</u> the "Armour of God" and effectively use it in faith. Faith will turn every piece of armour into Jesus Christ…that the works of the devil might be destroyed I John 3:8 and I come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. John 10:10

THE DECK OF CARDS

"The Soldier's Almanac, Bible And Prayer Book." During the North African campaign, a bunch of soldier boys had been on a long hike. They arrived in a little town called Casino, and the next day being Sunday, several of the boys went to church. After the chaplain read the prayer, the offering was taken up. Those of the boys who had prayer books read them, but one boy had only a deck of cards, so he spread them out. The sergeant who commanded the boys saw the cards and said, "Soldier, put away those cards." After the service was over, the soldier was taken prisoner and brought before the provost marshal.

The provost marshal said, "Sergeant, why have you brought this man here?" "For Playing cards in church, sir." "And what have you to say for yourself, son?" "Much, sir, "the soldier replied. The marshal said, "I hope so, for if not, I shall punish you severely."

The soldier said, "You see, sir, I have been on the march for six days and I had neither Bible nor prayer book, but I hope to satisfy you, sir, with the purity of my intentions. You see, sir, when I look at the ace, it reminds me there is but one God, and when I see the deuce, it reminds me that the Bible is divided into two parts, the old and new testaments. And when I see the three, I think of the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost. And when I see the four, I think of the four evangelists who preached the gospel. They were Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. And when I see the five, it reminds me of the five virgins who trimmed their lamps. There were ten of them-five were wise and were saved; five were foolish and were shut out. And when I see the six, it reminds me that in six days, God made this great heaven and earth. And when I see the seven, it reminds me that on the seventh day, God rested. When I see the eight, I think of the eight righteous persons God saved when He destroyed this Earth. These were Noah, his wife, their three sons and their wives. When I see the nine, I think of the lepers our Savior cleansed and nine of the 10 didn't even thank Him. When I see the King, it reminds me once again there is but one King of Heaven, God Almighty. And when I see the queen, I think of the blessed Virgin Mary. And the Jack or knave is the devil. When I count the number of spots on a deck of cards, I find 365, the number of days in a year. There are 52 cards, the number of weeks in a year. There are 13 tricks, the number of weeks in a guarter. There are four suits, the number of weeks in a month. There are 12 picture cards, the number of months in a year. So you use, sir, my deck of cards has served me as a Bible, almanac and prayer book."



the book of MATTHEW

Last month's issue we discovered Faces/Places.

Let's continue to read the book of Matthew and see what is revealed!

The gospel of Matthew is all about the eager anticipation for Christmas... the first Christmas! For centuries the Jews had struggled under the rule of foreign powers-the Assyrians, the Babylonians, the Persians, the Greeks, and now the Romans. Israel longed for the day when God would send his Messiah who would free them from this oppression and make them great and prosperous in the Land again. Matthew begins with the announcement that this day has arrived! "This is the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham" (Matthew 1:1).

Matthew's central theme is promise and fulfillment.

Though probably not the first gospel to be written (Mark likely has that distinction), Matthew has traditionally been placed first in the New Testament. This is appropriate since Matthew has the deepest roots in the Old Testament and Judaism. It is as though Malachi, the last of the Old Testament prophets, is reaching across the centuries and passing the prophetic baton to Matthew, who announces that the time has finally come.

Matthew's central theme is promise and fulfillment. God's promises to bring a Savior to Israel and to the world have come to fulfillment through Jesus the Messiah. This fulfillment theme is developed in a variety of ways in Matthew's gospel. Let's look at three of these: the genealogy, fulfillment formulas, and typology.

The Genealogy (1:1–17). In the West, people tend to view genealogies as rather tedious and boring. The Reader's Digest condensation of the Bible even deleted most of them! But for Matthew, this genealogy is unbelievably exciting, the key to who Jesus is and what he came to accomplish. Matthew introduces the genealogy by identifying Jesus as "the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham." All of these terms are enormously significant. *Messiah* comes from a Hebrew term meaning "Anointed One" and is translated into Greek as Christos or "Christ." Anointing with oil was a way of dedicating a leader (especially the king) to a special task assigned by God. Within Judaism the term "Messiah" came to be used of the end-time King chosen by God to accomplish his salvation.

The title *Son of David* reminds the reader that almost 1,000 years before Matthew, God had promised King David that God would one day raise up one of David's descendants, who would reign on his throne forever with justice and righteousness (2 Samuel 7:11–16). This "messianic hope" was picked up again and again by the prophets when Israel was downtrodden and oppressed (Isaiah 9:6–7; 11:1–5; Jeremiah 23:5–6; 33:15–16; Ezekiel 37:24–25).

"Son of Abraham" similarly recalls the covenant God made with Abraham another thousand years before David's time (Genesis 12; 15; 17). God promised Abraham that he would be the father of a great nation (Israel) and that all nations would be blessed through his descendant. As the Messiah, Jesus will bring salvation blessings not only to Israel, but to the whole world.

Together these titles and the genealogy as a whole are intended to show us that Jesus is the climax of human history, the Savior of the world.

Fulfillment Formulas. In addition to providing a genealogy legitimizing Jesus's claim to be the Messiah, Matthew repeatedly points out that what is happening is the fulfillment of Scripture—Jesus is bringing the history and story of Israel to fullness of meaning. Ten times he uses a formula something like, "This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken through the prophet."

In addition to these, a dozen or more times Matthew speaks of an Old		
Testament passage as fulfilled in Christ, although without an explicit		
fulfillment formula. While many of these passages are uniquely fulfilled		
by Jesus, others are "typological" fulfillments. By this we mean they		
are describing something that happened in the past but that foreshadows		
or points forward to its ultimate fulfillment in Christ. The persons or		

events described are anticipations of the coming Messiah (see the

example of Hosea 11:1 below).

Typology - By this we mean they are describing something that happened in the past but that foreshadows or points forward to its ultimate fulfillment in Christ.

Typology. Matthew uses typology to show that all of Israel's history is coming to its climax in Christ. Moses, for example, is a type of Christ. Just as Moses went up a mountain (Mount Sinai) to receive God's covenant on tablets of stone, so Jesus delivers his famous Sermon on *the Mount* (Matthew 5–7) to inaugurate the new covenant and illustrate the true meaning of the law. Just as Moses wrote the five books of the Pentateuch (Genesis—Deuteronomy), so Jesus gives five major discourses in Matthew (chs. 5–7; 10; 13; 18; 24–25). Similarly, just as Moses' face shone when he came down from the mountain (Exodus 34:29–33), so Jesus's face shines like the sun at the transfiguration (Matthew 17:2). In these and other ways Jesus is presented as a new and greater Moses, bringing in the new and greater covenant promised by God (see Jeremiah 31:31–34).

Matthew also develops a "new Israel" typology. Just as God brought his "son" Israel out of Egypt in the Exodus (Hosea 11:1), so he now brings Jesus up out of Egypt after King Herod tries to kill him (Matthew 2:15). Just as Israel was tested forty years in the wilderness and repeatedly failed to trust God, so Jesus is tested for forty days in the wilderness but succeeds by trusting God (Matthew 4:1–10). Israel is a (negative) "type" of Christ. Though the nation was unfaithful and failed to be God's light to the Gentiles (Isaiah 49:6), Jesus remained faithful and so fulfilled Israel's true role.

The Messianic King of the Jews... and Lord of All Nations. With his strong Jewish focus and emphasis on prophetic fulfillment, Matthew is likely writing to a predominantly Jewish-Christian community. In the face of opposition from unbelieving Jews, Matthew seeks to prove that Jesus is the Jewish Messiah, who fulfills the promises made to Israel.

Yet Matthew also makes clear that these promises are not for Israel alone. During his public ministry, Jesus tells his Twelve disciples to go only to the "lost sheep of Israel" (Matthew 10:5–6; "twelve" symbolizes Israel). This is because Israel was God's chosen people. They had the first opportunity to respond so that they could then be a light to the other nations (see Romans 1:16). Yet once salvation has been accomplished through Jesus's life, death and resurrection, Jesus gives his disciples the "Great Commission" to make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:18–20). The salvation prepared for Israel is now to go to *all nations* everywhere.

OLD TIME FAVORITE Mini Cherry Cheesecake - Betty Crocker Ingredients 24 vanilla wafer cookies

- 2 packages (8 oz each) cream cheese, softened
- ³/₄ cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon almond or vanilla extract
- 1 can (21 oz) cherry pie filling
- 1/2 cup toasted, sliced almonds

Steps

- 1. Heat oven to 375°F. Line 24 regular-size muffin cups with paper liners. Place 1 vanilla wafer cookie in bottom of each cup.
- 2. In large bowl, beat cream cheese, sugar, eggs and almond extract with electric mixer on medium-high speed 1 to 2 minutes or until mixture is light and fluffy. Spoon evenly into muffin cups (about 2/3 full).
- 3. Remove from muffin cups to cooling rack. Cool completely, about 30 minutes. Refrigerate at least 1 hour or up to 24 hours before serving.Bake 20 to 25 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.
- 4. Just before serving, top each cheesecake with generous tablespoon pie filling; sprinkle with almonds.

Expert Tips

For a festive touch, use holiday paper liners – you'll find them at specialty food stores.

You can make and freeze these for up to 4 weeks. Thaw in the refrigerator and top as directed.
