NEWSLETTER BIBLICAL QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

With Pastor Walker

I encourage all of you to share your questions you might have and I will address each one, Pastor Glenn

If you hurt someone by your words, should you feel as though they should "just get over it?" or as a Christian should you apologize? THE ANSWER IS YES, of course. Let me point out that the emphasis of forgiveness is not on that person, the emphasis of forgiveness is on you. Forgiveness is for you not the other person because some people will never come and apologize. What happens then is you play the video over and over and over. And over and over. As a result, it destroys you. So, forgiveness is always for you even though you have forgiven the other person.

There are times when people say things that will offend us, and that person did not mean to hurt you. Most times you take it wrong and so I think we have to be careful about judging other people. Does that make sense? Forgiveness is for you. So, when I say, "Get over it", I'm going to say it again, "Get over it."

How do I get over it? Ephesians 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you. Over and over again you will find it in scripture, that's just one verse, there are multiple verses. Let me read it again **Ephesians** 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

So how do I get over it? By forgiving that person. If I don't forgive them, the devil will play the video over and over and over and it will eat you up. Ok? So, how do we forgive? The same way as 4:32 says "As Christ has forgiven you"

Does that person deserve it? No, but you didn't deserve it either, but Christ forgave you anyways. Amen? Amen. Isn't that incredible?

How do I forgive someone that has hurt me? The same way that I was forgiven.

YOU CAN'T DO IT IN THE FLESH.

It takes **CHRIST IN ME**.

It takes CHRIST IN ME to forgive someone else.

That would be **GRACE**.

Hallelujah!

So, the same way that I have been forgiven now I can forgive someone else. I didn't deserve Christ's love or forgiveness. My sin separated me from God, but Christ loved me enough, went to the cross to forgive me and now I experienced His forgiveness. Now, I can share that same forgiveness with other people. THAT'S AMAZING ISN'T?

Mathew 21-22 Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven. What did Jesus teach you when he said that? He was teaching this, by the time you have forgiven someone 490 times, you would have forgotten about it! It won't even offend you anymore.

Galatians 2:20 I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. This is where you heard me say you can't hurt a dead man, right? So, if I am Crucified in Christ that means Glenn Walker is dead, Christ lives in me! It's a great day when we can get to the point. Amen? Amen. You can't offend me now. You are now unoffendable. 20 I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. That's how I live my life.

So, this is just a journey that all of us are on. A journey of maturity and growing in faith. Amen. So, I guarantee you the devil will always have someone that will try to offend you. It will never go away. Let me say it again; The devil is real, and he knows he is our enemy. These things are going to come because he is the enemy. That's why forgiveness is so important. If we don't forgive, it will beat us up and we will never live the life of Christ in the flesh as Gal 2:20 says.

Q. If someone didn't ask for forgiveness but you offer it anyways, but they throw it back in your face, what do you do?

Leave it at the foot of the cross. I am forgiving that person in my heart because I don't want my heart to harden and unforgiveness will do that.

FORGIVENESS IS THIS

I look at that person and I remember everything that they said and that they did because you don't forget. You heard of forgive and forget? Forget it, you don't. You are not made that way.

You look at that person and remember what they said and what they did but I hold no animosity in my heart towards them. That is forgiveness. I hold no animosity towards them. This forgiveness deal is a big deal and one of the ways you know you are maturing in the faith is if you forgive.

I look at that person and I remember what they did. Believe you me, I had to do this, but I hold no animosity toward the person. I had to do that for me, or I wouldn't be standing here today.

How did I do that?

The same way Christ forgave me, I can forgive other people.

By the GRACE OF GOD, I can let it go.

It was one of the hardest things I had to do. God took me on that journey, and I asked Him "Why?" a thousand times but I was asking the wrong question. I should have asked Him "God, what are you trying to show me?" cause God is ALWAYS teaching us. So, when I am talking about forgiveness this stuff is real to me and as I stand here tonight, I can remember everything, but I hold no animosity! Hallelujah! Thank you, Jesus!

Q. Do you have to forgive the person in person? What if the situation is dangerous to go in to forgive them?

You don't have to do that because some people you can't talk to. Some people will not acknowledge that anyways. Remember, forgiveness is for you, so you have to forgive them in my heart. It's personal between you and God because the devil is trying to destroy me and trying to destroy you. That's where forgiveness starts. That doesn't mean you cannot have a conversation with that person but the ultimate thing is, you cannot guarantee that that person will even acknowledge that or even want to talk to you about it and for weighing everything on that will never come to a forgiveness and will continue to eat you up.

What does the Lord's prayer say? Mathew 6:12-13 12 And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those that trespass against us. 13 And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen. So, we don't live in the flesh, we live in the Spirit. God's Spirit is leading us and directing us. God will open the door and make the way for you.

God takes us all on a journey, all of us, on our faith journey and there will be issues and circumstances that come up and all different ones. But God is dealing with you personally. The question is not "Why God" but the question is "What are you trying to show me, what are you trying to teach me. How many know He is our Shepherd, and He is leading us? Amen? Amen. So, He is teaching us through all these different experiences in life, I have learned that. God what are you trying to teach me, not anyone else, what are you trying to teach Glenn Walker.

Forgiveness is hard to do, I agree. But you still have to forgive. **He is trying to teach us to trust Him more.** To walk with Him daily and put our faith totally in Him. How many of you know He is our Shepherd, and He is teaching us through all of these many experiences of life? Remember to ask "God what are you trying to teach me? Not anyone else. What are you trying to teach ME"?

Heb 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him. We are all on a faith journey and that is what God is taking us on so, our faith is stronger today than yesterday or last week. If it isn't then we are not growing. Without faith it is impossible to please God. So, all these things that are happening there is a reason why God is taking us on that journey; to make us more like Christ. Christ is still working on me! HEY, AREN'T YOU THANKFUL FOR THAT! HE IS STILL WORKING ON ME! Don't plateau, let's keep going higher, let's keep increasing that faith. When people look at you, do they see Jesus? The devil is around the corner, and he is not going to go away until we go to heaven. Amen? Amen.

We are in a battle! The IMPORTANT THING IS, IT'S ALREADY BEEN WON!

What is your spiritual battle today? Just remember one thing, God is taking you on a journey. It's the most exciting part of this thing called Christianity, the journey. The destination will take care of itself. Amen. Praise the Lord. It is already secure. Amen? Amen. By the blood of Jesus. But every single day we are walking with Jesus on this journey called Faith. And we are trusting Him more and He is pouring out His spirit more and the miraculous power is coming in more because we are growing in faith, growing in love, growing in hope. Amen? Amen. If your challenges don't get greater your faith won't increase. Your challenges will come but the journey is exciting.

I challenge all of you to embrace the journey, embrace every day because it's a journey of faith.

We are not alone in the journey; God is with us along with your family in Christ!

Why is being a member of our local church importat?

When we are saved, we belong to the church of Jesus Christ, the universal church. So why is it important to belong to a local church? And then you read scripture, especially in the New Testament, there were all these local churches that were prominent during that time.

- a. A local church makes you **committed**. Commitment is good for you. We live in a world where people don't want to commit to anything anymore. When I came to Donation Hill Bible church, I unpacked my bags. **Hebrews 10:25** Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. Especially as you see the day that Jesus is returning approaching. How many of you know that we are seeing more of that every day? Amen.
- 1. A local church is a place to use your spiritual gifts. And all of you are different and we need everyone to bring something to the local church. So, it gives you a place to use your spiritual gifts.

2. It gives you **satisfaction** that you are a part of something that is eternal, God's Kingdom. I am **fulfilled** because I belong to something that is going outlast me.

So why is being a member of a local church important? It gives you commitment and that is good for you. It gives you a place to exercise your spiritual gifts. And that's important and that will give you fulfillment and satisfaction in God's Kingdom.

4. The 4th thing is, we need members because of the **business part**. Because of the legal aspect, the local church today is different than in the New Testament. Now we have buildings and land and things that are a part of our worship. We need members for the business part of it. One of the reasons **is that another group can't come and take it over.** I know of a church where a group of people went into the church and took it over by majority vote. That's why in the business part of it we need to have members that vote. I'm talking about the business part of it, not the spiritual part of it.

5.

***You need to come and vote and stand for what we believe in so that another group outside can't take us over and force some other doctrine. ***

"RESURRECTION"

The very word "resurrection" according to the dictionary, means to be raised from the dead. Have you ever considered what life would be like if there was NO RESURRECTION? The bible makes it very clear.

In I Cor. 15:14 Paul says... "And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain." In other words, we would all be hopeless.

Eph. 2:12 tells us... "That at that time ye were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having NO HOPE, and without God in the world."

I believe it may take many lifetimes, or even eternity to realize just what Jesus accomplished on the cross. But let's look at just a few:

I believe one of the greatest statements in the bible is found in John 3:16... "For God so loved the world, that He gave his only begotton Son, that whosoever (you and I) believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." It's important to note that Jesus came from the BOSOM of the Father (John 1:18). That's how close he was with the Father. So, he died for our sins.

If we go all the way back to the book of Isa. We read,... "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." (Isa. 53:5) He died for our healing!

In Matt. 27:51 we are told... "And, behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom, and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent." Notice that it was torn from TOP to BOTTOM (from God to man). That's how much He loves

Hebrews 4:16 says... "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." In Old Testament times, only the priest could enter the Holy of Holies. Now, because of what Jesus did on the cross, we have access to the very throne of God!

In John 20:1-16, we see Mary Magdalene coming to the tomb and seeing Jesus for the first time after he was resurrected. I believe that if she were alive here today she would be singing-- "HE'S ALIVE AGAIN."

APRIL 3, 2022 "PREPARING THE DISCIPLES"

Before going to Jerusalem, Jesus was preparing the disciples for what was about to happen to Him. Mark 10:32-34 tells the story.

"And they were in the way going up to Jerusalem; and Jesus went before

them: and they were amazed; and as they followed, they were afraid. And he took again the twelve, and began to tell them what things should happen unto him. (33) Saying, behold, we go up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man shall be delivered unto the chief priests, and unto the scribes; and they shall condemn him to death, and shall deliver him to the Gentiles:(34) And they shall mock him, and shall scourge him, and shall spit upon him, and shall kill him: and the third day he shall rise again."

The disciples were afraid. The knew that Jesus had enemies in Jerusalem, and they didn't know what was going to happen. Can you imagine what must have gone through their minds. Hearing that Jesus would suffer such treatment. I doubt that they were able to fully understand. And especially when he said that they would kill him and after 3 days he would rise again. Sure, they saw miracles while he ministered. They saw healings and even people raised from the dead. But Jesus himself?? I doubt that they could comprehend it all until after the resurrection. Then, it probably all came together for them.

In like manner, I believe it could be possible that Jesus is preparing us for what lies ahead. In fact, most of Mark, chapter 13 tells us what to expect. But especially verse 7. "But when ye shall hear of wars and rumors of wars, be ye not troubled: for such things must needs be; but the end shall not be yet." Look what we are going through right now.

Il Tim. 3:1 tell us of "perilous days." "This know also, that in the last days perilous times dhall come." The word "perilous" according to the dictionary simply means DANGEROUS! There is no doubt that we are living in that time right now. I believe the Lord is preparing us.

And when they drew nigh unto Jerusalem, and were come to Bethphage, unto the mount of olives then sent Jesus two disciples. (2) Saying unto them, go into the village over against you; and straightway ye shall find an ass tied and a colt with her: loose them, and bring them unto me.

- (3)And if any man say ought unto you, ye shall say, the Lord hath need of them: and straightway he will send them.
- (4)All this was done done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying,
- (5) Tell ye the daughter of Sion, behold, thy king cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.

- (7)And brought the ass, and the colt, and put on them their clothes, and they set him thereon.

It's interesting to note, that BOTH the mother and the colt were brought. And, usually when an animal has never been ridden before, it will revolt. But this little animal was very gentle.

Shortly after this Jesus went into the temple and drove out the money changers. This did not go over very well at all. And the scribes, Pharisees, and

Elders sought how they could get rid of him. About a week later, the Hosannah's tuned to words of crucifixion. But before the crucifixion, Pilate examined Jesus, (just as the priests did with the sacrifices in the Old Testament). Then Pilate uttered these words... "I find no fault in this man" (Luke 24:4).

However, the cries of the people prevailed. And Jesus, the Son of God was crucified. Jesus suffered the pain of being whipped, nailed to a cross, shedding His blood (all of it) so that you and I could be free and have an eternal home in heaven.

APRIL 17, 2022 "EASTER"

Jesus had just been crucified. One of the most hideous, deaths anyone at that time could ever have gone through.

Just briefly—they used nails about 6 to 8 inches long to nail him to the cross. They were driven into the wrists, and one nail through both feet. In order for Jesus to breathe, He had to push Himself up arching His back. And, as if that wasn't enough, He was stripped of all His clothes. He was naked. No wonder Heb. 12:2 tells us... "Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, DESPISING THE SHAME, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God." He knew that joy would be waiting on the other side of the tomb, but he would have to endure the pain and agony of the cross before that would happen. Would YOU want to go through that!!?

Jesus had to endure all this for over 3 hours. Can you imagine this kind of suffering? A few minutes before He died, a Roman soldier drove a spear into his side. All that was left was water. He had poured out all his blood!

Everyone is familiar with Jesus hanging on the cross, but have you considered what He endured before that? He was beaten with 39 stripes. It's been said that many men never recovered from that beating.

And, it's been said that the 40th stripe would be the DEATH stripe! Also, notice that it is said that there

HOW DO YOU PRAY?

Scripture Reading - Philippians 4:5-7

The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:5-7

Thoughts:

Is it better to pray standing up, sitting down, kneeling, or bowing down? Should our hands be open, closed, or lifted up to God? Do our eyes need to be closed when we pray? Is it better to pray in a church building or out in nature? Should we pray in the morning when we get up or at night before we go to bed? Are there certain words we need to say in our prayers? How do we begin our prayers? What is the proper way to close a prayer? These are common questions asked about prayer. What IS the proper way to pray? Do any of the above things even matter?

Most often, prayer is viewed as a "magic formula." God does not answer our prayers based on when we pray, where we are, what position our body is in, or in what order we word our prayers. We are told in 1 John 5:14-15 to have confidence when we come to God in prayer, knowing He hears us and will grant whatever we ask as long as it is in His will. Similarly, John 14:13-14 states, "And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it." According to these and many other Scriptures, God answers prayer requests based on whether they are asked according to His will and in the name of Jesus (to bring glory to Jesus).

So, what is the proper way to pray? Philippians 4:6-7 tells us to pray without being anxious, to pray about everything, and to pray with thankful hearts. God will answer all such prayers with the gift of His peace in our hearts. The proper way to pray is to pour out our hearts to God, being honest and open with God, He already knows us better than we know ourselves. We are to present our requests to God, keeping in mind that God knows what is best and will not grant a request that is not His will for us. We are to express our love, gratitude, and worship to God in prayer without worrying about having just the right words to say. God is more interested in the content of our hearts than the eloquence of our words.

Thoughts:

Do you operate your life by sight or vision? One of the greatest gifts God gave us is the gift of vision. Vision is the engine that drives progress. Sight is a function of the eyes, while vision is a function of faith. Sight is the ability to see things as they are, while vision is the ability to see things as they could or should be... Sight is based upon what your eyes determine to be true; while vision focuses on what God's Word says is true. Sight is also fueled by an idea that will bring temporary satisfaction, while vision is fueled by an idea that is so powerful that it can live beyond the grave. Don't let your sight dominate your vision.

Sight without vision is dangerous because it blinds your hope for a better future. Sight causes you to see the problems around you instead of the solutions that live in you. You see stacks of bills, a near negative bank account, the economy and job market on the downturn, and your family on the wrong road to salvation. Why do we go to church and how can we avoid being inauthentic in worship? We must remember that we have an audience of One. Psalm 100:1 says, "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands". YHWH

There was a moment when Moses had the nerve to ask God what his name is. God was gracious enough to answer, and the name he gave is recorded in the original Hebrew as YHWH.

Over time we have arbitrarily added an "a" and an "e" in there to get YaHWeH, presumably because we prefer vowels. But scholars and rabis have noted that the letters YHWH represent breathing sounds, or aspirated consonants. When pronounced without intervening vowels, it sounds like breathing. YH (inhale): WH (exhale).

So, a baby's first cry, his first breath, speaks the name of God. A deep sigh calls His name – or a groan or gasp that is too heavy for mere words. Even an atheist would speak His name unaware that their very breath is giving constant acknowledgment to God. Likewise, a person leaves this earth with their last breath when God's name is no longer filing their lungs.

So, when I cannot utter anything else, is my cry calling out His name? Being alive means, I speak His name constantly. Is it heard the loudest when I am the quietest?

In sadness, we breathe heavy sighs. In joy, our lungs feel like they will burst. In fear we hold our breath and must be told to breathe slowly to help us calm down. When we are about to do something hard, we take a deep breath to find our courage. When I think about it, breathing is giving him praise. Even in the hardest moments! This is so beautiful and fills me with emotion every time I grasp the thought. God chose to give himself a name that we cannot help but speak every moment we are alive. All of us, always, everywhere. Waking, sleeping, breathing, with the name of God on our lips.
